Our recycling efforts!

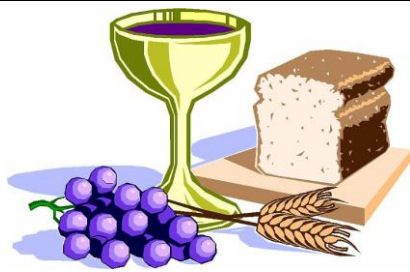
