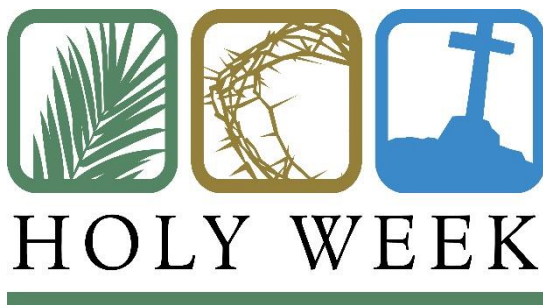
Magic and Martinis with James Alan, magician and sleight-of-hand artist

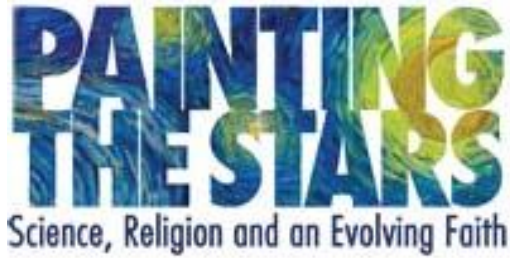
Please mark your calendars and join us at Incarnation, for an intimate afternoon of jazz presented by the Incarnation Fundraising committee.

Wing and a Prayer – Thursday, April 27

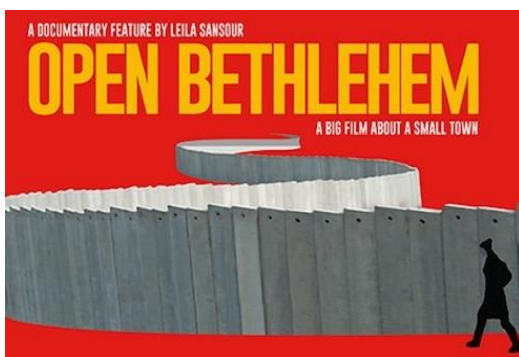
We meet at 6:30pm at Monaghan's. Cost: \$25 per person including food and drink. RSVP Winkie Macdougall. Everyone is welcome!

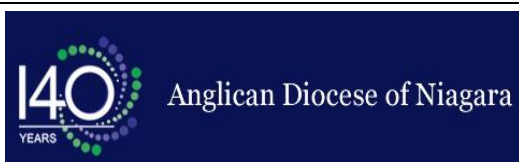


'OPEN BETHLEHEM' Friday, May 5 at 7:30pm at Incarnation

Open Bethlehem is a movie that tells the story of Bethlehem born Leila Sansour's efforts to draw international attention to what is happening to the birth place of Jesus under the Israeli occupation. Bethlehem has been encircled by the 26-foot-high 'Separation Barrier' wall, causing severe difficulties for Palestinians living in the town or outside of it, to enter or to leave. Wael Kabbani, the Executive Creative Director of Iambic Dream, the producers of the movie, will be present to add further comments and to answer questions. 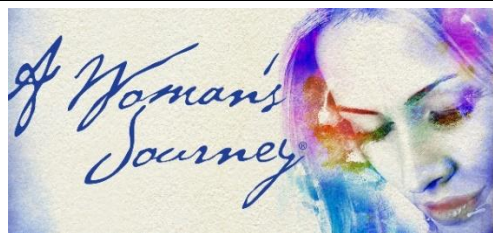

Our recycling efforts!

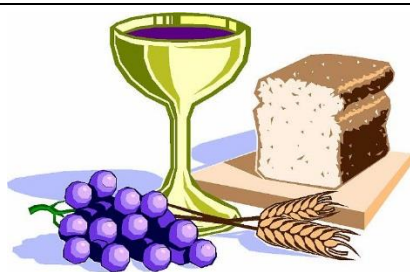

Receiving Communion

All people at Incarnation are invited to receive the bread and wine at communion. The bread is received from the priest who stands between the servers who offer wine from the common cup; choose whatever side is free. You may choose to receive from an individual wine cups available to the left of the altar. Take one, consume the wine and replace the empty cup in the same spot. We hope this provides an inclusive approach to communion where all are welcome.
