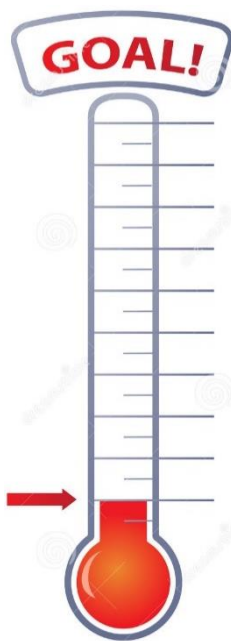

Geo Thermal Project

The engineering report for our Geo Thermal Project is in progress and we are looking ahead to have 100% approval from the diocese in September to move forward with the installation shortly thereafter. In the meantime, prior to getting diocesan approval and in order to get guarantees on the bank loan necessary to complete the project, we must raise or have pledged by the parish a significant level of the funding in place.

Hence we are asking you to prayerfully consider making a pledge to this campaign in order that we can ensure its success. This pledge can be in the form a one-time gift or it may be over a five-year commitment. There are green pledge forms available at the office or you may pick one up after church on Sunday. The goal we hope to achieve in gifts in pledges is approx. \$175,000. Presently we have raised and have on hand \$65,000. Hence we have **\$110,000** to go.

We meet at 6:30pm at Monaghan’s. Cost: \$25 per person including food and drink. RSVP Winkie Macdougall. Everyone is welcome!

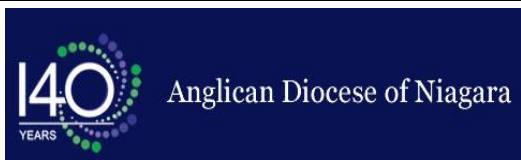


Christmas Market – Saturday November 18th

Wednesday mornings, 10am-11am

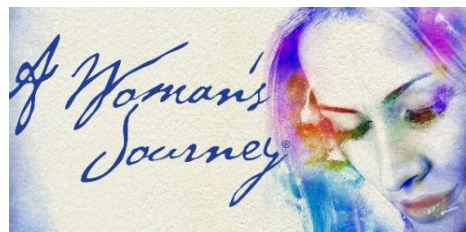

Our recycling efforts! New procedures

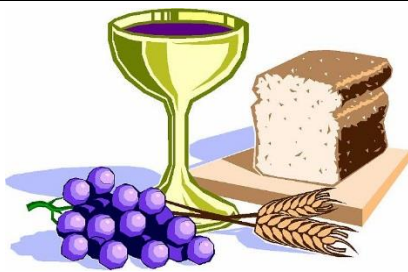
Thank you to all our hard-working volunteers who prepare the coffee and help with the set-up and clean-up of our premises. The daycare has been testing a new green bin routine with much success. We have almost completely eliminated critter attacks!

- Start a new **SMALL** green bin for each service or event. Before leaving, tie off the bag and move the **SMALL** green bin waste to the shed and deposit into the **LARGE** green bin. This will eliminate any critter attacks. No green bins are to be left in the kitchen or out the back door after each event. If you don't know where the key to the shed is located, please ask a **Warden** or office staff.
- Green bin liners are located in one of the 3 stacked multi-coloured baskets in the kitchen on the counter by the small sink
- All recycling must be emptied after each coffee hour or event. The large blue recycling bins are located at the back door. Please dump all recycling into the larger bins before leaving the church.

Receiving Communion

All people at Incarnation are invited to receive the bread and wine at communion. The bread is received from the priest who stands between the servers who offer wine from the common cup; choose whatever side is free. You may choose to receive from an individual wine cups available to the left of the altar. Take one, consume the wine and replace the empty cup in the same spot. We hope this provides an inclusive approach to communion where all are welcome.
