Bishop Michael Bird and Bishop-elect Susan Bell are heartbroken to share the tragic news that the Reverend Canon Robert Fead, rector of St. Jude's in Oakville, died on Monday, April 30, in a motor vehicle collision. Canon Fead was a gifted leader and colleague who served with distinction as a faithful servant of God.

As news of Canon Fead's death is shared, the bishop and bishop-elect ask for prayers. In particular, they have invited the clergy and people of the diocese to pray for Rob's wife, Veronica, and his mother, Pat; for his friends and family and colleagues; for the clergy and people of St. Jude's, Oakville and for all the churches and military units where he served.

In a message to the clergy of the diocese, Bishop Bird and Bishop-elect Bell wrote:

“rooted in the Easter season, may the hope of the Resurrection sustain us in this difficult time.”

Inca Movie Outing – *Indian Horse*

On the evening of May 10 The Eco Justice committee in conjunction with Lynne and David Jenkins would like to invite everyone to see *Indian Horse* at film.ca. *Indian Horse* is an adaptation of the acclaimed novel by the late Richard Wagamese.

Wagamese, an award-winning author and journalist, was an Ojibway from the Wabaseemoong First Nation in northwestern Ontario whose work was deeply influenced by Indigenous experiences in Canada's residential school system.

He called himself a second-generation survivor of the government-sponsored schools, attended by his parents and extended family members. In many of his 13 titles from major Canadian publishers, he drew from his own struggle with family dysfunction that he attributed to the isolating church-run schools.

In this movie, we follow the life Saul Indian Horse, who as a young boy was taken from his family and placed in a church run residential school. It is compelling, thought provoking and beautifully filmed in the Georgian Bay area around Sudbury.

Part of our responsibility to fulfill the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission is to hear the truth, and this is one way for us to do that. We will gather in a meeting room at the theatre after the show to share our feelings about this moving story. Tickets can be purchased on the evening of the event at the theatre. Our recycling efforts! New procedures

Thank you to all our hard-working volunteers who prepare the coffee and help with the set-up and clean-up of our premises. The daycare has been testing a new green bin routine with much success. We have almost completely eliminated critter attacks!

- Start a new **SMALL** green bin for each service or event. Before leaving, tie off the bag and move the **SMALL** green bin waste to the shed and deposit into the **LARGE** green bin. This will eliminate any critter attacks. No green bins are to be left in the kitchen or out the back door after each event. If you don't know where the key to the shed is located, please ask a Warden or office staff.
- Green bin liners are located in one of the 3 stacked multi-coloured baskets in the kitchen on the counter by the small sink
- All recycling must be emptied after each coffee hour or event. The large blue recycling bins are located at the back door. Please dump all recycling into the larger bins before leaving the church.

Receiving Communion
