Participate in the Run4LH 5kn run/walk to raise funds to support their important programs.

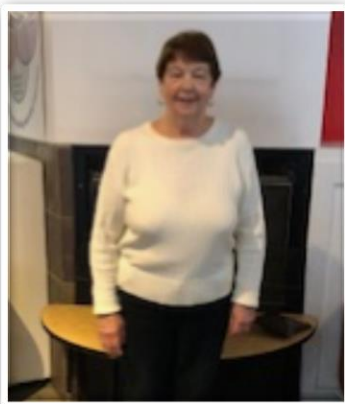
