### Looking for Help with a Meal Train

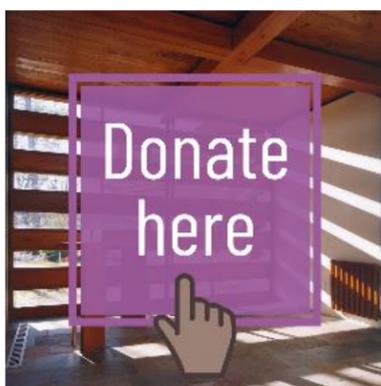
